Prof. Dr. Wilfried Schlüter confirmed as the president of the European Association for Directors of Care Homes for the Elderly

During the meeting of the General Board of the European Association for Directors of Residential Care Homes for the Elderly (E.D.E.) in Luxembourg, Prof. Dr. Wilfried Schlüter has been confirmed in office of the president of the Association, which he had held since 2000, for the next four years. From 1994 to 2002, he was the president of the German Association for Home Directors DVLAB (Deutscher Verband der Leitungskräfte von Alten- und Behinderteneinrichtungen). Since 1998 Schlüter has taught at the faculty of Healthcare Management of the University of Applied Sciences in Zwickau (Westsächsische Hochschule Zwickau).

Meanwhile, 24 member organisations from 19 European countries work within the E.D.E. to stand up together for the improvement of the long-term care and of their occupational image. Many specific offers of qualification trainings for directors from the care sector have been already realised. The Association has defined a binding Code of professional conduct for home directors and made the first steps towards an academisation of the profession of home directors. For the current period of office, Prof. Schlüter and the Executive Board members from Slovenia, Czech Republic, Switzerland and Luxembourg have set themselves, amongst others, the following goals:

- intensification of the cooperation with the EU bodies

- implementation of the branch-specific project of the quality management system E-Qalin in other European countries
- participation in international projects in the range of the long-term care
- professionalising of the internal association work.

Furthermore, at the meeting in Luxembourg, the members made preparations for the 11th European E.D.E. Congress entitled "Time Out" which will take place in Luxembourg from 24th to 26th September 2009.

The vocational seminar for healthcare professions of the Adult Education Centre of Oberbergischer Kreis in Gummersbach is one of the five training institutes in Germany which have been accredited by the E.D.E. and train home directors within a two-year-advanced training course at least in accordance to the European training standards.

E-Qalin transfer



After the quality management system E-Qalin had been successfully introduced in five European countries (Austria, Italy, Luxembourg, Slovenia and Germany), in more than 100 institutions for the elderly and disabled persons, the following project entitled "E-Qalin Transfer" has started in October 2008 in Baden/Austria.

The goal of this project is to implement the validated and transnational quality management system E-Qalin in France and Great Britain, including the training for process managers in social institutions.

Besides the analysis of the market potential and of the conditions of spreading and cooperation in France and Great Britain, another objective is to develop a viable franchise system (manual, rules, agreements, market evaluation). Furthermore, the project partners should create requirements for an accreditation of E-Qalin throughout Europe.
